## Statement

Much like turbines harnessing the wind's power, these paintings capture the shifting and surging impulses of nature, and have become for me a visual record of my own wandering spirit. My current goal is to represent our everyday relationships with the landscape through creative equilibrium of color."

Nicole Thibodeau grew up immersed in the natural beauty of Taos, New Mexico. As the daughter of painter Rich Thibodeau and actress Karen Thibodeau, creativity was intertwined with daily life. She painted her way through a B.A. in studio art from Bethany College and an M.F.A. from Fort Hays State University. She also pursued a love of writing with an M.A. in English from FHSU. Further studies took her to the Art Student's League in New York, Studio Art Centers International in Italy, and Lacoste School of the Arts in France. Currently, she lives in Hays, Kansas, where she paints in her studio and also designs art activities for teens at the Hays Public Library. Her work is featured at ArtSpace Gallery in Marquette, Kansas, The GypseRose Boutique in Hays, and online at www.nicolethibodeau.com.
