Artists' Reflections On Themselves

Ten years ago for the 2016 *Artist Self-Portrait Invitational* exhibition we observed that, "The dictionary definition of self-portraiture is fairly straightforward: a self-portrait is a representation of an artist that is drawn, painted, photographed, or sculpted by said artist." That simple description of what an artist's self-portrait can be leaves much to be desired, with no hint of the creative possibilities when there are no constraints of rules or guidelines. The challenge to artists to create new work and push boundaries that was met in 2016 has been pushed even further, resulting in an exuberant display of self-reflections here in 2026!

With 141 artists contributing, the checklist reveals an astonishing variety of mediums and styles chosen to convey each artist's inner self. How the artists see themselves at work, at play, in studio, at home, in nature, and in connection to family and ancestors provides a kaleidoscope of color and imagery to browse and enjoy.

Some artists have looked back to where they've been by including glimpses of their childhoods, while others meditate upon where they are now in their careers. A few artists have revisited their 2016 entries to update ten years of living and creating. Some reference recent events in their histories – including such things as covid times and dental emergencies! Some see themselves reflected in store front windows, or imagined in the role of bandana-ed cowboy on the plains, or, condensed into a hanging item of clothing. Some artists look further back in history, dressing themselves in elaborate costumes and wielding quill pens. Some sculpt themselves as charming fairy dolls, sharing the whimsy in their souls.

Some self-portraits are obvious likenesses. There are traditional depictions of recognizable selves - windblown on the Kansas prairie, or covered with sand and seaweed on a coastal beach, or in oblique views with cultured pearls, or set with essential dogs and cats of the family. Some photographic views spark humor, caught on field trips to local attractions along with chicken travelers.

Ceramic artist Michaela Groeblacher believes that, "Every piece you do is a self-portrait, even if it doesn't look like you."¹ The abstracted views of self in this exhibition are many, provoking thoughtful assessments of what must be important to the artists. Some facial features blend with residential homes, some colored blocks of wood assemble into geometric shapes that suggest a familiar bearded head. Interpretation of all the self-portraits is left to each viewer, unraveling clues and hints shared by the artists who have set narrative series or assembled collaged plastic toys, cut paper and fabrics, and even employed car parts and found objects to show us pieces of the whole. Looking to the future, the words of Mexico's foremost self-portraitist Frida Kahlo (1907-1954) speak for all: "I leave my portrait so that you will have my presence all the days and nights that I am away from you."²
